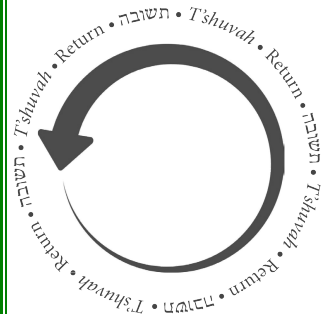

**High Holy Days**

More properly known as the Yamim Noraim "Days of Awe" they are the holidays of Rosh Hashanah ("New Year") and Yom Kippur ("Day of Atonement"). In 2019 Rosh Hashanah marks the start of the Jewish year 5780. **High Holy Day Services**

**Erev Rosh Hashanah:** Sunday, Sept. 29, 7:00 PM

**Rosh Hashanah (1<sup>st</sup> Day):** Monday, Sept. 30, 10:00 AM

**Rosh Hashanah (2<sup>nd</sup> Day):** Tuesday, Oct. 1, 10:00 AM

**Kol Nidre:** Tuesday, Oct. 8, 7:00 PM

**Yom Kippur:** Wednesday, Oct. 9

Morning Services 10:00 AM

Services/Activities all day

Neilah Service 6:00 PM

**Tickets**

We don't sell tickets. Everyone is welcome. Donations are appreciated; they help keep our doors open to everyone. For security purposes everyone attending the High Holy Days must register this year. You can register in advance (preferable), or before boarding the shuttle bus at St. John's Church on Rte. 375 during the High Holy Days.

**Parking**

The onsite parking lot is open to all on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur after 2:30pm. At all other times during the High Holy Days there is only space for members with parking passes. **This year shuttle buses will only run from the lot at St. John's Roman Catholic Church.** Buses will run from one hour before each service continuously until after all scheduled services and Kiddush. Exceptions: Yom Kippur when buses stop running at 2:30 and all cars can park on-site after that time; Second day of Rosh Hashanah when all cars park at WJC. **Overnight Parking** No cars can be left on-site or in the off-site lot overnight.

**Handicap Accessibility**

High Holy Day services are held in a beautiful tent on a grass field. Weather can affect the surface. There is a drop-off area available for disabled passengers. There is limited onsite parking available for handicapped drivers with state issued permits. We ask that drivers without a disability drop off passenger(s) and use our regular parking spots.

**Identification**

For security purposes everyone attending the High Holy Days must register. You can register in advance (preferable), or before boarding the shuttle bus at St. John's. Those who register at St. John's will be asked to show ID.

**Infants and Toddlers**

There is space in the building set aside as a quiet space for nursing, napping, etc. If the building is not open for children's services or activities, ask anyone with a nametag to find someone to let you in.

**Drop off** There is a drop-off area available.

**Shuttle Bus Schedule**

See "Parking" above. When we use shuttle buses they run continuously from one hour before services until after all scheduled services and Kiddush.
